 Of the 3 finishers (Robic, Trevino, & Kish) from last year, only Robic finished this year. Two DNFs (Haase & Achermann) from last year,

triumphantly reached Atlantic City this year. 8 out of 12 finishers were rookies.

The were five time gaps between the teams, which were less than an hour, the smallest of which was only 14 minutes between Mucho Gusto and Landis Team Phoenix. The biggest gap was over 22 hours between Dry Heat and 60+. The gap between the winning Team Beaver Creek - Vail and the last place Team Wisconsin was 3:20:34. This was more than a full day longer than the time range between the first and last solo finishers. Solo winner Robic's time was faster than the last team. The top two teams were more than twice as fast as the slowest solo rider.
